Light and refreshing

Meantime London Pale Ale *abv 4.3%*

Pale Ale, when first released, was too popular for the British hop market to keep up with so American varieties were imported to keep up with demand. These created a clean, citrus led style that is ultra-refreshing. With grassy, citrus notes, this is perfect for the elusive English summer.

Lovibonds 'Henley Gold' (bottle conditioned wheat beer) *abv 4.6%*

Oxfordshire, England

Brewed using a traditional Bavarian yeast this stunning summery wheat beer has flavours of banana and cloves with a slight sweetness, but at the same time is exceptionally revitalising.

Brodies Organic Transition Pale Ale (bottle conditioned) *abv 4.1%*

This beer, brewed in Leyton at the Sweet William Brewery is hoppy, ultra-refreshing and with grapefruit citrus notes that make this far too quaffable.

Fuller's 'London Pride' abv 4.7%

Based in Chiswick, Fuller's London Pride is one of the capital's iconic beers.

Innis & Gunn Oak Aged Beer abv 6.6%

Edinburgh, Scotland

Apparently this brewery discovered, by accident, that maturing their beer in an oak barrel (a process more readily associated with wine) improved it. A stroke of luck as the results are superb, with its flavours of caramel and spice.

Created in 1995 to commemorate the brewery's 150th anniversary this is a rich, malty beer full of dried fruits and spice, with a clean hoppy finish.

This is from one of London's newest breweries, this amber ale has a nutty caramel flavour with a refreshing citrusy finish
