



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## WOMEN IN REVOLT! ART AND ACTIVISM IN THE UK 1970–90

ED. LINSEY YOUNG

A crucial exploration of the wealth and diversity of work by women artists working in the 1970s and 1980s during a period of seismic social and political change.

Surfacing the wealth and diversity of work created in the UK during the 1970s and 80s, a period of seismic social and political change, *Women in Revolt!* demonstrates how women's needs were marginalised within mainstream culture and reveals how these artists used radical ideas and methods to confront issues that will resonate with contemporary audiences — from access to healthcare and class struggles to ecological disaster, racism and misogyny.

A timely exploration of the work and lived experiences of a postwar generation of women artists that have largely been omitted from art historical narratives, this exhibition book is a celebration of a highly creative, politically engaged and determined community of women that paved the way for future generations and, ultimately, changed the face of British culture. 

# EL ANATSUI BEHIND THE RED MOON

ED. OSEI BONSU

From histories of migration and African decolonisation to the evolution of human civilisation, El Anatsui's innovative work pushes the boundaries of sculpture. This lavish exhibition book accompanies his eagerly anticipated installation for the famed Turbine Hall at Tate Modern.

One of the most distinctive artists working today, El Anatsui is best-known for his cascading metallic sculptures constructed of thousands of recycled bottle-tops articulated with copper wire. Repurposing found materials into dazzling works of abstract art, Anatsui's work explores themes that include the environment, consumption and trade.

The book will be lavishly illustrated with photos of this new sculpture, while also serving as an introduction to the artist's life and work. Newly commissioned texts from a fascinating range of perspectives, along with a conversation between Anatsui and curator Osei Bonsu, are accompanied by images from the artist's studio. Since Tate Modern opened in 2000, the Turbine Hall has hosted some of the world's most memorable and acclaimed works of contemporary art, reaching an audience of millions each year. The annual Hyundai Commission gives artists an opportunity to create new work for this unique context.

**Osei Bonsu** is Curator of International Art at Tate Modern, where he is responsible for organising exhibitions, developing the museum's collection and broadening the representation of artists from Africa and the African diaspora.

## RHEA DILLON AN ALTERABLE TERRAIN

**RHEA DILLON** 

Probing material histories and Black feminist epistemologies, Rhea Dillon evokes the fragments of a conceptual body — eyes, hands, feet, mouth, soul, reproductive organs and lungs — in this poetic assemblage of responses to colonialism, patriarchy, and Black female labour.

Rhea Dillon's solo exhibition at Tate Britain, *An Alterable Terrain* brings together her new and existing sculptures as a conceptual fragmentation of a Black woman's body. It examines material histories, theories of minimalism and abstraction, and Black feminist epistemologies to evoke elements of an amorphous body, including the eyes, mouth, soul and hands. Viewed together, these disparate elements underline the foundational role Black women's physical, reproductive, and intellectual labour has played in the history of the British Empire.

Featuring Dillon's poetry, alongside new writings and reprinted extracts by her and other contributors, and

illustrations of the exhibition and individual works, this unique volume illuminates the links between historical sites of dispossession and contemporaneous sites of exploitation and overwork, and underlines how structures of power have an enduring presence in the production of Caribbean and British identities.

Rhea Dillon is an artist, writer and poet based in London.



## MIKE KELLEY GHOST AND SPIRIT

ED. CATHERINE WOOD

Coinciding with the first major UK posthumous retrospective of Mike Kelley, this book highlights the significance of the American artist's influential four-decade career on the development of art since the 1970s.

Mike Kelley (1954–2012) liked to play with how an artist appears, exists and inhabits a role and how an artwork 'communes' with a viewer. Central to his ambitious explorations of memory, history, and the future is his consideration of how one's individual subjectivity is shaped by familial and institutional power structures within society.

Ghost and Spirit highlights the significant and prescient questions about the role of art, and of the artist, and about gender and class, in terms that stem from Kelley's own position as a white, heterosexual man in post-modern, capitalist America. Featuring a diverse range of voices, it explores the major works and themes of Kelley's career, while drawing attention to aspects of his practice associated with performance, activism and collaboration, to emphasise his continual deflation of his own authority, and his willingness to invent and inhabit several identities.

Covering over four decades of Kelley's work spanning performance, sculpture, video and installation, and articulating challenges to power, gender, class and sexuality, this book is a pertinent presentation of the breadth, complexity and significance of Kelley's influential practice.

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

# **CHILA BURMAN**

#### A feast of colour and texture, Chila Burman's first major monograph celebrates one of Britain's most exciting contemporary artists and her extraordinary body of work from across four decades.

Chila Burman is a British Asian artist known for her radical feminist practice, her joyful neon light installations and her use of kaleidoscopic colours. Ever since the emergence of the modern seasonal fashion industry in the nineteenth century, Western artists have been engaging with fashion's impact, meaning and forms in their artwork. In portraits, the clothes that sitters wear are often revelatory about their wider context or identity, or hold some symbolic meaning. As time has passed, small sartorial details artists used to provide visual praise or condemnation of their subjects have lost their legibility.

Exploring the rich variety of ways in which artists in Britain have engaged with these possibilities within their work, this book examines the intricate relationships between the history of modern art and fashion. Offering in-depth explorations of over fifty artworks from the last 150 years, it explores the ways modern fashion has featured within art and, in some instances, the ways art has, in fact, become fashion. Discover stories as diverse as the relationship between the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood and the creation of the London department store Liberty, the free advertising Burberry received in paintings of the First World War and how the epicentre of London's 'Swinging Sixties' scene led to the creation of some of the most important and powerful artworks of the twentieth century.

# FIVE HUNDRED YEARS OF BRITISH ART

KIRSTEEN McSWEIN

Newly reissued in a luxury paperback format, this guide to the highlights of Tate Britain's collection provides an essential introduction to the extraordinary development of British Art over the centuries.

The British art in Tate's collection is rich with imaginative invention and reinvention. This panoramic book celebrates this aesthetic ingenuity as an ongoing story, revealing how 500 years of art can function as a fascinating lens through which to deepen our understanding of ourselves and society, past and present, both in in Britain and throughout the rest of the world.

British art is notable for genres unique to itself: group portraits, known as 'conversation pieces', focusing on social relations between friends, family and allies; themes from British literature, particularly Shakespeare, Milton and Tennyson (rather than classical mythology); and topical subjects in the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries reflecting the wars with France and the scientific innovations of the Industrial Revolution. Hogarth ushered in an art of social engagement, as did the artists associated with the Young British Art movement more recently.

Lavishly illustrated, this generous companion to the Tate collection provides a sumptuous compendium of the rich history of British art, designed to offer readers an overview of the collection and its remarkable range of art.



Artist and writer Sean Burns explores the nature of death and its tangled relationships with life and love as depicted in art.



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# CLAUDIA ANDUJAR

For over five decades Swiss-born Brazilian artist Claudia Andujar has devoted her life to photographing and protecting the Yanomami in the Amazon, one of Brazil's largest indigenous groups.

Attempting to translate visually the shamanic culture of the Yanomami, she experiments with a variety of photographic techniques to create visual distortions, streaks of light and saturated colours.

The trust Andujar earned over the years is so strong that the Yanomami, who destroy personal items belonging to a person when they die – including photographs – made an exception for her work. Now in her nineties, she continues to stand by them in their struggle for survival.







Lieko Shiga makes intimate portraits, set among mystical landscapes and interiors, integrating her personal experiences with grander mythologies into surreal and fantastical images. Without using digital retouching, she evokes the twilight zone between dream and reality.

This volume focuses on her series *RASEN KAIGAN (Spiral Shore)* 2008–12, photographs of the village of Kitakama in Japan before and after the devastating 2011 tsunami, capturing the spirit and history of the place and its people.

Shiga's work is represented in museum collections around the world. In 2012 she won the Higashikawa Prize for new artists, and in 2021 she received the Tokyo Contemporary Art Award.
