Working with bodies, movement, personal memories and music, Eddie Peake explores physical form in its many manifestations. His 'bodies' become sculptural and sexual objects via choreographed actions, encouraging the audience to give in to voyeuristic desire. Peake describes a brief encounter with nature.

There are two of us and four of you, and we are different from one another, but for the most part our differences are irrelevant. Beyond the six of us, there are others close by. Regular disagreements and skirmishes erupt, but everyone is excited by one another's presence. Those in positions of responsibility try to maintain a sense of harmony to varying and ever-changing degrees of success. Some of us are given treats by the mechanic, whilst others are on first name terms with the newsagent, although Steve is not his real name. The two of us start to notice that the four of you have other places that you call home, and at a certain point, the unspoken bonds between us are called into question. Many of my concerns no longer converge with yours.

I handed you a stick that had been set alight. It was from the house I had stayed in in the countryside, and by now it was cold and black in parts from fire. You threw it away, commenting that we did not need it, and that it would just become clutter. I didn't argue because I knew you were right, but I couldn't help but feel a sense of loss, it had come all the way from the countryside after all.'

Eddie Peake's performance is in conjunction with *Inside/Outside: Materialising the Social* and takes place on 21 July, 21.00 (ticketed).
