Dear staff and other people connected to Tate Modern

We would like to invite all the people at Tate Modern to 'Clap in time' for the Saturday live event-day 'Actions and Interruptions'.

Our work is all based on the idea of group participation in simple actions to create a kind of choreographic effect.

We would like to ask all the staff and other people connected to Tate Modern (including members of different education or tour programmes, the bookshop, cafe and information desk staff, and so on) to pause whatever you are doing on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> of March around 3 o'clock when you hear someone clapping and start clapping along in time for as long as you can. If you are in the middle of writing, cleaning, eating, invigilating etc. on your own we ask you to clap along for at least a little time. Even if you are serving a customer in the café, bookshop, ticket booth or cloakroom we would like you to excuse yourself and simply start clapping. You are free to both avoid people's gaze or to inform people around you that they are invited to join you.

We would like the sound of clapping to spread through the building from person to person and temporarily interrupt all activities on its way.

We will announce to the visitors that 'all the people at Tate Modern will clap in time' and hopefully they will realize that they too belong to the group defined as 'all the people at Tate Modern' and all join you.

Therefore we are profoundly hoping we can rely on your involvement as key participators or agents in our piece to be able to make all people engage in this transitory action and clap in time together for a few minutes.

We will be at Tate Modern to discuss the piece and brief all participants on the day. Thanks a lot for your participation in our situation, we are very excited to see how it will all come together.
