WARHOL SNACKING MENU

SAVOURY

TUNA FISH DISASTER

Inspired by the artist's piece of the same name when two ladies contracted botulism and died from a tainted can of tuna.

PÂTÉ FOR THE CAT

Warhol felt social pressure to eat extravagantly and bought luxuries such as pâté. He joked that his 'hairdresser's cat ate his leftover pâté at least twice per week.'

CAVIAR WITH THE SHAH

Pre-revolution Warhol attended events at the Iranian embassy. He remarked that he could see the Shah's grip on power waning as the portions of caviar declined at each subsequent party.

CHOCKS CREAM CHEESE SANDWICH

In his biography The Philosophy of Andy Warhol he recounts carefree days of going into 'Chocks' for his cream cheese sandwich.

SWEET

COCA-COLA JELLY

A recurrent theme in his work and a symbol of Americana, here boiled down and served as an edible coke float.

BRINGING HOME THE BACON ICE CREAM

The son of poor immigrants he cited his work ethic and of wanting to 'bring home the bacon.' Served with a tomato soup reflecting his interest in Campbell's.

CORNFLAKES PANNACOTTA

Kellogg's cornflakes feature in several of the artist's works and there are photographs of him eating a bowl at The Factory.

MARS CAKE

Warhol noted a little luxury at home while growing up was 'a chocolate bar between two pieces of white bread – cake.'
